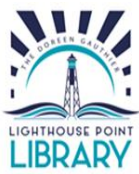
**Summer registration opens May 10<sup>th</sup> for Lighthouse Point residents and June 10<sup>th</sup> for residents of other cities.**

## Frequently Asked Questions...

**Why do I have to register for Library programs?...** To allow as many children as possible the opportunity to enjoy Library programming, while still being mindful of the Fire Marshal maximum capacity for each room, we require online registration for all daytime Library programs.

**How do I register?...** An active Lighthouse Point Library card is required to register. Registration opens in May for Lighthouse Point residents and business owners and in June for residents of other cities. Register online at [Lighthousepointlibrary.com](http://Lighthousepointlibrary.com) Calendar/Register unless otherwise instructed. The password is the first SIX numbers of your Lighthouse Point Library Card. Lighthouse Point residency will be confirmed.

**What is 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten?...** This is a national program that promotes the practice of reading BEFORE a child sets foot in school. To take part, parents pick-up their reading record for the first 100 books at the Lighthouse Point Library. Then each time you and your newborn, infant, or toddler read a book (any book and you can repeat books) your child will color-in a starfish on the reading record. When your child has colored in all 100 starfish on their first reading record they have read 100 books! Each time they complete 100 books come back to the Library for a new record and special recognition. **This program is supported by the City of Lighthouse Point and the Friends of the Library.**

**What is Library Story Time?...** Library Story Times may include short stories, songs, finger play, flannel boards, crafts or other educational elements. The program length, stories, and activities, are geared toward the target audience of the story time program. All programs are designed to teach social skills, listening comprehension, letter/number recognition, vocabulary, and to build a foundation for reading success. In addition to educational enrichment and patron enjoyment, staff is mindful of Library safety, space, and noise while designing any programming. **This program is supported by the City of Lighthouse Point and the Friends of the Library.**

**What are Kids' Book Tastings?...** Just like movie trailers, Book Tastings give readers a preview of books, but not the whole story. Each Book Tasting will have one, fun-uniting theme that covers a wide variety of fiction and non-fiction books on that topic. To make sure ALL reading levels are covered, picture books to young adult titles will be included. Crafts, activities, games, and other educational elements may be included. **Dates : July 13 (Pets), July 20 (Ships), July 27 (Magic).** **This program is supported by the City of Lighthouse Point and the Friends of the Library.**

**What are the Library S.T.E.A.M. LABS?...** Library S.T.E.A.M. Labs (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) are a pilot program that cover a different topic, Library resources, and hands-on applications each week. Topics MAY include hydrodynamics, robotics, aerodynamics, and circuits just to name a few. To allow as many children to participate as possible, all labs held in Group A will cover the same topics and have the same activities as Group B. **This program is supported by the City of Lighthouse Point and the Friends of the Library.**

**What are Teen and Tween Board Game Nights?...** This is a monthly meet up for teens and tweens to play board and card games from Pandemic to Exploding Kittens to Hogwarts Battle to old school Battleship. The ground rules are no video games, no gambling, no drug, alcohol, or sexually themed games, no excessively violent games, and games must finish within the program time slot. **This program is supported by the City of Lighthouse Point and the Friends of the Library.**

**\*What are Teen Summer Drawing Classes @ The Library?...** Classes are for individuals ages 13 and up who are interested in learning new or additional art skills and techniques. The instructor will model basic and advanced skills in drawing and other art forms. Bring a sketch book or journal. **There is a materials fee per person, per session paid by participants.**

**\*What is Summer Art Camp @ The Library?...** Students will learn basic skills and techniques using a variety of materials. Each week can stand alone OR can build upon skills learned from the prior week. Advanced students will be able to work independently. **There is a materials fee per person, per week paid by participants.**
