To slow the spread of COVID-19 the City of Lighthouse Point Library will be **CLOSED** to the public beginning Wednesday, March 18, 2020 until further notice.



**But you can still get Library books, DVDs, and audiobooks while we are closed!**

While we are closed to the public library staff are still filling requests for books, DVDs and audiobooks. Reserves are taken 24/7 online or by phone Monday through Friday between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00.

## **How to reserve Library materials:**

**Online** - Go to [lighthousepointlibrary.com](http://lighthousepointlibrary.com), go to catalog, and logging into your Library account at the top right corner. Your password is your phone number (without dashes). As you search the catalog you can select items you'd like to reserve. Remember the staff will need a little time to pull items from the shelves. Once they have, they will call to let you know your items are ready for pickup. **By phone** - Call us at 954-946-6398, Monday through Friday between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. and a library staff member will reserve the items for you. Time to pull reserved items is still needed.

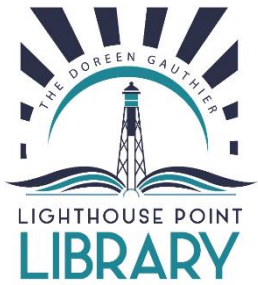
## **To pick up your reserves:**

Reserved items can be picked up at the Lighthouse Point Library Monday through Friday between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Patrons must call ahead just before pickup so that a library staff member can either leave their bagged reserved books for them at the front door of City Hall or bring items to them curbside (in their car). Note as of 03/19/20 City Hall is closed to all walk-in visitors.

## **To return items:**

Service for returning physical items will remain uninterrupted through the use of the outside Book Drop.

## #1 Question of the day: How do you clean Library books?



Currently the Library is only taking returns through the drop box. Three times a day gloved staff member are emptying the drop box and cleaning both the outside and inside covers of all books, DVDs, and audiobooks with Lysol wipes. They are then dried with paper towels. Books are also left fanned open in the sunlight (UV) for a while before bringing them into the Library. At the end of this process we are also cleaning the drop box and book carts with Lysol.
