


THESE TANGLED VINES by Julianne MacLean




NON-FICTION BOOK CLUB


THE WORST HARD TIME by Timothy Egan

AMERICAN PAIN by John Temple



THE LIBRARY BOOK by Susan Orlean


On the morning of April 29, 1986, a fire alarm sounded in the Los Angeles Public Library. As the moments passed, the patrons and staff who had been cleared out of the building realized this was not the usual fire alarm. The fire was disastrous: it reached 2000 degrees and burned for more than seven hours. By the time it was extinguished, it had consumed four hundred thousand books and damaged seven hundred thousand more. Investigators descended on the scene, but more than thirty years later, the mystery remains: Did someone purposefully set fire to the library—and if so, who?

In the 1920s, the richest people per capita in the world were members of the Osage Indian nation in Oklahoma. After oil was discovered beneath their land, they rode in chauffeured automobiles, built mansions, and sent their children to study in Europe. Then, one by one, the Osage began to be killed off. The family of an Osage woman, Mollie Burkhart, became a prime target. Her relatives were shot and poisoned. And it was just the beginning, as more and more members of the tribe began to die under mysterious circumstances.

HOW DOES THE WAITLIST WORK?

CDBG SENIOR PROGRAMS

Each year the City of Lighthouse Point applies for CDBG funding for Library Senior Programs.

The receipt of this funding is NOT guaranteed from year to year. Per grant guidelines, CDBG programs are ONLY open to Lighthouse Point residents who are ages 62 and over.

The CDBG grant and senior programs are coordinated by Library staff.

WHAT DOES CDBG FUND?

CDBG funding covers a portion of participants' supplies (such as books, yoga mats, or watercolor paints/brushes), select in-Library equipment (such as iPads or printers), the use/cleaning of facilities, and the staff time required to teach and coordinate CDBG classes.

HOW DO I ENROLL IN THE CDBG PROGRAM?

Enrollment in the CDBG program must be done in-person at the Library.

Proof of City residency, age, and a signed FY22/23 CDBG enrollment form are required.

CDBG enrollment is valid from October 01, 2022 to September 30, 2023.

HOW ARE SPOTS IN CDBG CLASSES ASSIGNED?

As of September 26, 2022, all open spots in Fall 2022 CDBG programs are on a first come basis. There is a limit of three CDBG classes per participant. When a class becomes full, a waitlist is started. Participants are pulled from the waitlist by lottery.

Participants who have a registered space in a CDBG class, but do NOT attend TWO sessions in a row, will lose their spot in that class.

Reminder, in December 2022 there MAY be a registration lottery for spots in Winter 2023 CDBG Classes.

The Winter 2023 lottery will give first priority to eligible residents who have NOT attended ANY CDBG class sessions since October 01, 2022.

WHAT WERE THE RESULTS OF THE FALL CDBG CLASS LOTTERY?

To provide equal access to FREE CDBG Fall classes and supplies, an enrollment window was open from Thursday, September 07 to Friday, September 23.

On Monday, September 26, all enrolled participants were entered into a LOTTERY for spots in each CDBG class. **ALL enrolled participants got their FIRST choice!**


Some lucky participants were also picked in the lottery for their second and/or third class choice.

CDBG ZOOM BOOK CLUB

IN-PERSON REGISTRATION REQUIRED. THIS IS AN ONLINE CLASS THROUGH ZOOM

This is a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funded program. CDBG programs are only open to Lighthouse Point residents ages 62 and over. Proof of City residency, age, and a signed enrollment form in the CDBG program are required. Registration and enrollment in a CDBG program must be done in-person at the Library. All CDBG paperwork and waivers must be on file to register and/or enter the registration lottery. Participants who attend a course will receive FREE grant-funded supplies. Participation in the program is a requirement of CDBG funding. Individuals who enroll in the program but do not attend TWO sessions in a row will lose their space in the program.



THE MAID by *Nita Prose*


THE STORY OF ARTHUR TRULUV by *Elizabeth Berg*
