


COFFEE FILTER FISH



Materials:

For 2 Fish And 1 Jelly Fish:

- 1 Cover For Your Work Surface
- 3 Coffee Filters Basket Shape
- 5 pieces of 9" Ribbon (or yarn)
- 2 Paper Towels (or other stuffing)
- Washable Markers Multiple Colors
- Water (in a spray bottle if possible)
- 1 Page of Construction Paper (optional)
- 3 Sheets of Paper
- 2 Rubber Bands Scotch Tape
- Craft Glue (optional)
- Coat Hanger (optional)
- 6 Googly Eyes (optional)
- 3 Pieces of String (optional)



Directions:

First, make the fish.

- Cover your table with a plastic sheet or a thick pile of paper to avoid staining the surface.
- Put down a piece of paper. On the paper, open and flatten one coffee filter so it looks like a circle.
- Use 3 or more different colored markers to color the filter. Coloring should be in large blocks and overlap.
- With a spray bottle of water (or dribbling water from your fingers), wet the filter. Use enough water to cause the colors to freely bleed into each other. Let the filter dry.

Next, make one fish and then another.

- Peel the dried filter off the paper. Lay it flat on the table, colored side face down.
- Crush a piece of paper towel (or any other stuffing) into a ball and place it in the center of the filter.
- Gather the filter around the ball and secure it with a rubber band. The covered ball is the body of the fish and the rest is the tail of the fish.
- Use glue to attach googly eyes or use a marker to draw eyes.
- Make a second fish by repeating these steps.

And, make one jellyfish.

- Prepare another coffee filter just like you did for the fish.
- Fold the flattened filter in half forming a semicircle, colored side out. This is the jellyfish
- body. Tape the rounded edge closed.
- Cut 5 long pieces of ribbon (or yarn) and tape to the straight edge of the filter. The ribbon should hang from the body. These are the tentacles.
- Use glue to attach googly eyes or use a marker to draw eyes.

Finally, put it all together!

- Make an Ocean Mobile to display your creatures. Use string and tape to hang the jellyfish and the two fish from a coat hanger. Hang your mobile!
- Another way to display your fish is to draw an ocean scene on construction paper and tape your creatures to your picture.
- Enjoy the ocean breeze!
