


PAPER PLATE DINOSAUR



Materials:

- 1 Paper Plate
- 2 Toilet Paper Cardboard Tubes
- Paint Paint Brush
- Craft Glue or Tape Scissors
- 2 Googly Eyes (optional)
- Marker (optional)

Directions:

First, create the head and body.

- Cut the paper plate in half.
- One half of the paper plate is your dinosaur's body. The straight edge will attach to the legs and the curved border will be its back.
- If your dinosaur has spikes along its back cut spikes along the round side of the paper plate.
- On the other half of the paper plate draw a dinosaur tail and a dinosaur neck topped with a
- head. Cut these out and attach them to the body using tape or glue.

Next, create the legs.

- Cut the toilet paper tubes so you have two tubes that are the same height.
- On the top of each tube cut two slits that are 3/4" deep and across from each other.

Finally, put it all together!

- Paint both sides of the body and the toilet paper tubes.
- Choose whatever color paint you like. It's okay to use more than one color. Set aside to dry.
- When dry, insert the straight side of the dinosaur's body into the slits on the tubes so the tubes become the legs.
- Glue on googly eyes or draw or paint eyes. Your dinosaur is now ready to rock and roll so have fun!
